BRUNSWICK Seventeen Brunswick elementary school students participated in the Cleveland Regional Invention Convention Jan. 12 at the Great Lakes Science Center.

Entering inventions were 16 students from Huntington and one from Kidder Elementary.

The team of Shannon Bahr and Cheyenne Wurm won first place for fifth graders with their Double Duty Laundry Basket. Both will receive a trophy and a \$500 College Advantage scholarship.

Two other students rated in the top 50: Third grader Lane O'Bryant with his Grass Paper, and fourth-grader Griffin Becker with the Egg Crack-a-Lacker.

The convention showcased inventions from 150 students from first to eighth grades with 110 inventions. They represented 13 school districts in Cuyahoga, Medina and Lorain counties.

The students had to present their invention to judges and answer specific questions.

This was the first time Brunswick students competed. The students' teachers are Kristen Luckas, Carissa Crytzer and Alice Ogonek.
